Courses for FY2 Doctors

FY2 Simulation Days

One of the mandatory courses you are required to attend during your FY2 year is a Simulation Day. This takes place in the Simulation Centre at Addenbrooke's Hospital.

This is an excellent course providing for 'hands on' experience in the treatment and management of critically ill patients through simulation scenarios using the simulation manikins.

FY2 Clinical Skills Days

The second mandatory course you are required to complete during your F2 year is a Clinical Skills Course. There are 2 parts to this course (Part A & Part B). You are required to complete both parts.

Part A involves chest drain insertion, suturing and knot tying. Part B is CVC insertion.

WikiFY

WikiFY forms part of the Addenbrooke's induction programme and is a way of recording all the information that your predecessors wish they'd known before they started their rotations four months ago. It is aimed at FY1s and FY2s, and it should help you feel more prepared and comfortable during your first few shifts here at Addenbrooke's.

All Foundation Programme posts have their own quirks and peculiarities and the WikiFY aims to help you quickly get familiar with these, so you can become a more effective member of the team as quickly as possible. All specialities and shifts have their own WikiFY page containing lots of information that your predecessors wish they'd known when they were in your position, including information about the normal day, out of hours cover, team structure, the typical patient, various hints and tips you might find useful, and lots more. All content on the WikiFY is created and updated by foundation doctors at Addenbrooke's and you will all be given login details to the site which will allow you to edit pages of the WikiFY. You will be required to make at least one edit to a page in order to be signed off by your Clinical Supervisors.
